Financial Assistance

If you have not begun the financial aid application process, get started by completing these required forms. Both forms are available on our part-time student financial assistance page at **www.sacredheart.edu/applicationprocess**.

- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). Enter SHU's school code, 001403, on your application and we will automatically receive a copy. The FAFSA may be completed online.
- The **SHU Confidential Information Form (CIF)**, which may be completed online or on paper.

Once you are admitted to Sacred Heart University, visit the SHUAwards web site at http://shuawards.sacredheart.edu. To activate your account, enter your seven-digit Student ID number found at the top of your acceptance letter and follow the prompts to create your PIN. This will allow you to monitor your award and review important information and pending documents or forms.

Credit Evaluations

- Credits are evaluated once a student has been admitted to SHU
- Up to 66 credits from a 2-year institution will be accepted
- Up to 90 credits from a 4-year institution will be accepted
- Must have a C or better in that course for credit to be accepted
- If a student has already earned 60 credits or more at another institution, we will waive our common core (except for Catholic Intellectual Tradition 202 which is a required course for all students)

Career Planning





Career Development and Placement Center

Part-time students are encouraged to visit the Career Development and Placement Center (CDPC), which offers a wide range of resources to assist students in making educated decisions about majors and careers; identify their skills and abilities; market themselves to employers; secure internships and relevant work experiences and obtain full-time employment and graduate school admission after graduation.

At the CDPC, students find career coaches and counselors that specialize in particular areas of interest and ensure students' career planning progresses appropriately. Programs and services include:

- Alumni mentoring program
- On-campus interviews and annual career fairs
- Networking events and presentations by industry experts
- Guidance on using social media in career development
- Résumé, interviewing, networking and job search workshops
- PioneerNetwork, SHU's online career management system with internship and job postings by over 10,000 employers
- Self-assessment testing and activities
- Counseling for goal-setting and action planning
- Major in Success program for students undecided on a major

Internships and Job placement

All majors at SHU encourage an internship before graduation, and SHU's location in Fairfield County, along with our extensive network of recruitment partners, allows for students in all majors to gain experience through internships, field placements and practicums. Students also intern in New York City throughout the school year and in their home states during summer breaks.

One year after graduation, approximately 95% of SHU graduates were employed in career-related positions or attending graduate school in disciplines including law, medicine, veterinary medicine, business, education, social sciences and more.
